Letter from the President

Already half of 2016 is behind us and we've been busy! We've already rescued over 308 dogs as of July and placed 286 in loving adoptive homes. Sometimes people question me about why we do this. Sometimes it's hard; our fosters and volunteers become so tired, but then we see those little faces looking out of the bars of a shelter and we know that we can't leave them behind.

These are the storries of just some of the precious fur babies Lap Dog Rescue of NM has been called upon to take under our wing. Some are still receiving veterinary care, some are in extended recovery with their loving fosters, some are medically complicated waiting for space and funding so they may come to us, get the treatment they so desperately need to regain their health and quality of life and be ready for their forever homes. Some come to us as a result of traumatic injury (broken bones, shattered pelvis', broken jaws, tumors to remove, to name just a few) but many of these special pups find their way to LDRNM due to the severe neglect that's befallen them, leading to serious medical complications. Take little Trooper for instance. He sat in the shelter for two days, with a gunshot wound to his leg without veterinary assistance before we even knew about him. Through LDRNM and our extraordinary veterinary team, he's had surgery on his leg and although he will require further surgery later on, he already has a wonderful adoptive home of his own! Little

Cody had a broken tail that needed to be amputated and subsequently developed an infection which is now healing. Gus continues to courageously battle a skin allergy. Sam delivered puppies somewhere, suffered a broken paw, now has an internal infection, and is waiting until we having funding available to care for her needs and provide her another chance for a better life. These are just a few of their stories. We do not always know the depth of their stories when they are rescued.

So, this is why we do what we do. And, to keep doing this, we continue to need your help. We are a very small non-profit that does so much for so many with a tiny budget. Our single largest expense is our veterinary bills. Many of our wonderful volunteers pay for food and many other items personally to provide for the care of their little ones.
